That whereas, a marriage is shortly intended to be celebrated between the above bound *William R. Rainey* and *Miss Mary L. W. Elliott*, now if there is no lawful cause to obstruct the said marriage, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

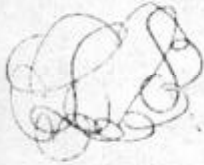
